Municipal taxes

There are four tax installments each year. Bills are mailed twice a year with the interim bill showing the amounts owing for the first two installments (February 28th and May 31st) and the final bill showing the amount owing for the last two installments (September 30th and November 30th). The interim bill is based on 50% of 2021 total taxes billed. The final bill is based on your 2022 assessment multiplied by the approved 2022 tax rate.

To avoid late fees for ANY payments made to the municipality, make sure we receive your payment in the municipal office by the due date. Allow 2-3 business days for online payments. Please highlight dates on postdated cheques.

We have changed the way we issue tax notices. We used to hold back tax notices for properties where taxes were paid by mortgage companies and mark them paid before mailing them. Now, we send all tax notices once they are generated. If your mortgage company pays your taxes, the tax notice you receive will show the name of the company and a mortgage number on the bill.

Request for reconsideration

A request for reconsideration with MPAC must be filed by March 31st, 2022, for the current tax year (2022). For all property concerns regarding assessment, please contact MPAC (Municipal Property Assessment Corporation) at 1.866.296.6722.

Changes to rates

New development charges and water and sewer rates took effect January 1st, 2022. Information is available on our website.

Reminders from the utilities department

Utility bill due dates are January 31st, April 30th, July 31st and October 31st.

Please watch the municipal website and local paper for spring watermain flushing dates.

If you are moving, please contact the municipal office with as much advanced notice as possible so a final water meter read can be done. You will need to provide a forwarding address for the final bill.

An appointment must be scheduled for all water turn-ons. Seasonal water turn-on appointments will be booked on Tuesdays. No person or persons shall operate the municipal water shut off (curbstop) other than the water operator who is acting on municipal staff's direction or authority.

Municipal election 2022

Dog tag renewal deadline

Do you have a new canine companion or are you thinking of getting one? Our animal control bylaw requires that dogs be registered within 15 days of taking possession. Licences must be renewed each year before February 28th. Renewal forms can be found on our website.

Spring green waste collection

The Municipality will be offering weekly spring green waste collection in urban areas every Tuesday in April. Green waste must be bagged in brown paper bags and placed at the curb for pick up. Any green waste bagged in plastic will not be collected. Check our website and social media this spring for more information.

Green waste can also be taken to the Stanley landfill during its regular hours free of charge, or it can be dropped off at the green waste facility in Hensall at the west end of Richmond St. South.

Help protect the municipal right of way

Each year, municipal staff see places where the municipal right of way (road allowance) has

been encroached on. Municipal road allowances can hold buried infrastructure like cables and water lines. They also provide clear sight lines for drivers. Encroaching on the municipal right of way can lead to maintenance and safety issues, especially if crops are grown too close to the road or if landscaping is placed too close. Over time, the equipment used to plant or maintain these encroachments can damage the road base. For more information, please see the Municipality's encroachment policy (By-Law 126-2019).

Reduced load season on our roadways

With spring thaws come reduced loads on municipal roadways. Each year, municipal roads have reduced load (half-load) restrictions placed on them from February 1st to April 30th. Please obey the posted signage. If you are hauling heavy loads, please plan ahead. More information is available by calling the Public Works department.

Reduce stormwater inflow and infiltration

Inflow and infiltration (I&I) occur when water, groundwater and stormwater enter the sanitary sewage system through sump pumps, downspouts and/or holes or cracks in pipes. I&I can reduce the capacity of the sanitary sewage system leaving less for existing residents and future growth. Additionally, inflow connections may cause sewage backups in basements.

To help prevent I&I, make sure downspouts are disconnected from the sanitary sewer system and flowing properly towards the storm sewer. Use rain barrels. Ensure your sump pump is not connected to the sanitary sewer lines.

Connecting sump pumps and private drainage to sanitary lines is in contravention to By-law 9-2020. For more information, contact the Public Works department.

Working alarms save lives!

The Bluewater Fire department wants to remind everyone about the importance of having working smoke and carbon monoxide alarms.

Install working smoke alarms on every storey of your home and outside all sleeping areas. It's the law! For extra protection, install a smoke alarm in every bedroom and a carbon monoxide alarm on every storey. Test your smoke and carbon monoxide alarms monthly. Change alarm batteries annually or whenever a low-battery warning sounds. Always follow the manufacturer's instructions for installing, testing, maintaining, and replacing smoke and carbon monoxide alarms.
